

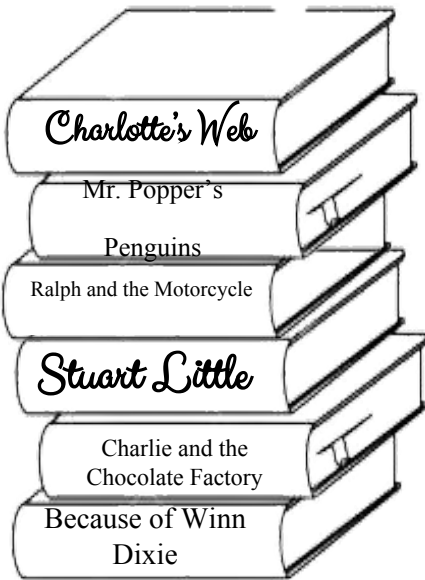

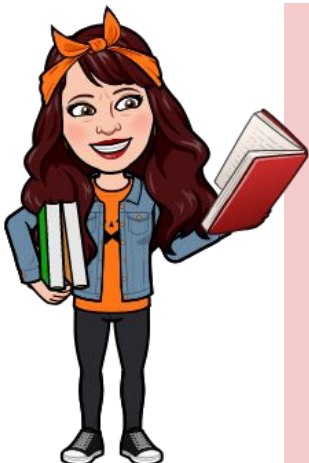

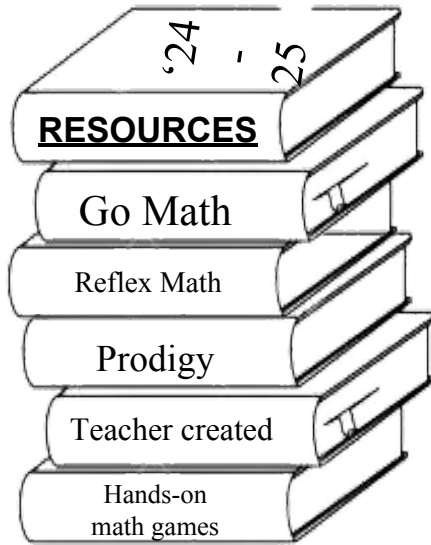

course objectives

Place value: Understand multi-digit whole numbers.

Addition/Subtraction: Perform multi-digit arithmetic

Multiplication/Division: Introduce multiplication and division, understand the relationship between the operations, and demonstrate fact fluency.

Fractions: Understand and identify fractional parts of a whole and compare and order fractions.

Area/Perimeter: Understand the difference between area and perimeter and be able to find both measurements of rectangles.

Measurement: Solve problems involving measurement and estimation of temperature, liquid volume, mass or length; tell and write time to the nearest minute and solve problems by calculating time intervals.

Geometry: Identify, compare, and classify shapes and their attributes.

Data: Represent and interpret data using tally charts, tables, pictographs, line plots, and bar graphs.

Word problems: Solve one and two step word problems.

Real-world problems: Apply mathematical ideas to real-world problems.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Refine basic skills (throwing, kicking, catching) using different implements and equipment, and introduce pickleball for net/wall game fundamentals. Begin endurance running to build stamina, encourage goal setting, and promote individual achievements in fitness. 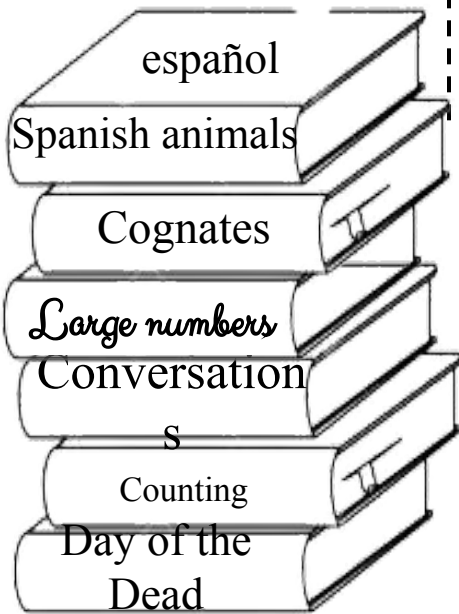

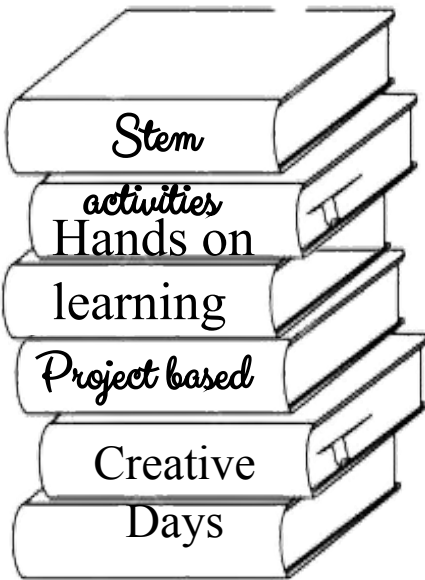

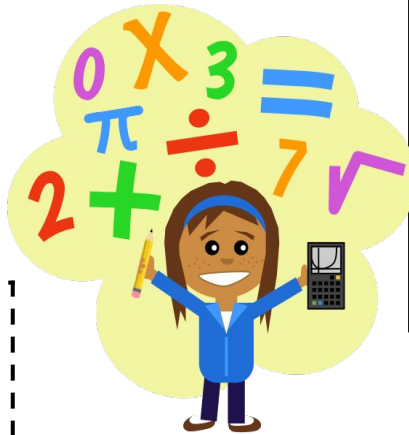
