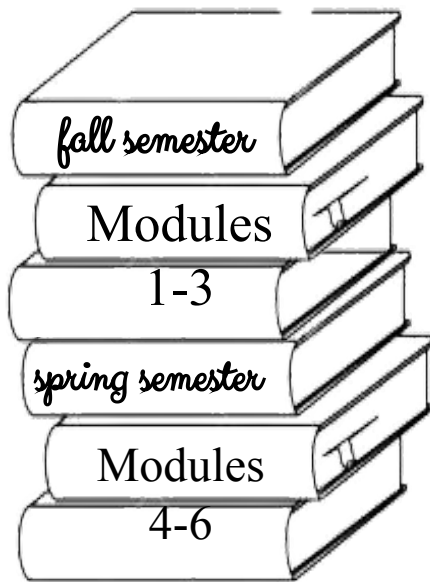


Kindergarten English Language Arts



Grades

Grades are based on the following scale

course objectives

Students will work with each letter of the alphabet with a focus on phonemic awareness (sounds) handwriting, phonics (letters to grapheme as well as) identifying and producing rhyming words. The students will do word work with syllables, segmenting sounds, learn high frequency words in the foundational skills part of each lesson. Students will build knowledge and language through stories provided as well as reading and vocabulary. Author and illustrator roles, story elements, comprehension, topic, theme and central idea are an integral part of each module lesson. As the modules progress, students will learn to build and sound out cvc words with instruction and pre decodable text. Writing is also integrated into the modules, with a focus on narrative, opinion, fiction, nonfiction with an introduction to grammar.



grading categories

Students will complete a weekly Module test with listening comprehension and foundational skills.

Students will also complete an end of Module test with concepts taught.

Dibels assessments will be given 3x a year focusing on letter naming fluency, phonemic awareness, nonsense and real word reading fluency.

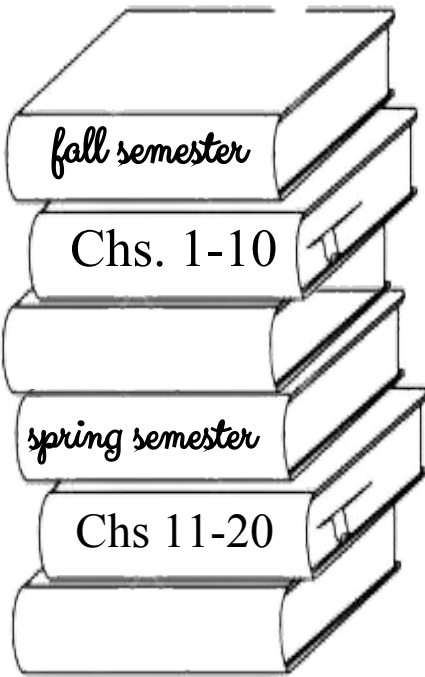

Kindergarten Math



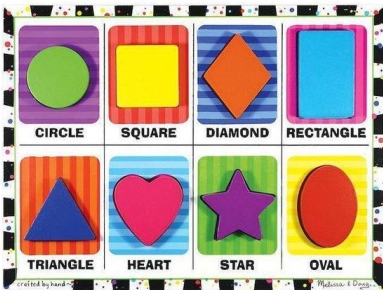
course objectives

Students will be able to identify, combine, decompose numbers 1-10 in the fall semester. They will learn the concept of 2D and 3D shapes and successfully be able to add and subtract within 10. The second semester will consist of numbers 11-20 in depth, composing and decomposing teen numbers, as well as counting by 10's and 1's from 20 and beyond.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Focus on basic movement skills (running, jumping, hopping), spatial awareness, and simple group games. Introduce pursuit-and-evade games for agility and mini-volleyball for hand-eye coordination. Emphasize foundational skills like throwing, kicking, and catching, as well as basic jump rope skills to develop timing and rhythm. Introduce net and wall games to help build timing, while encouraging enjoyment in movement and play.

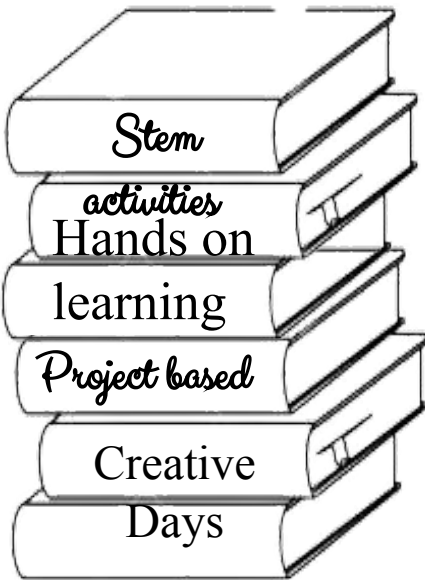

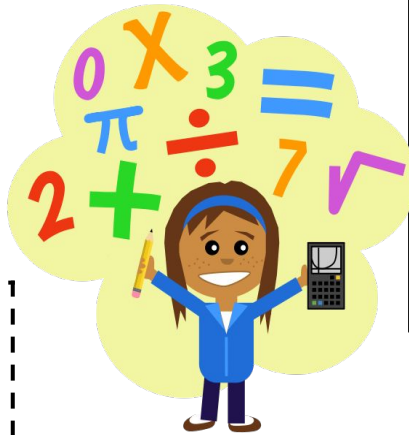
