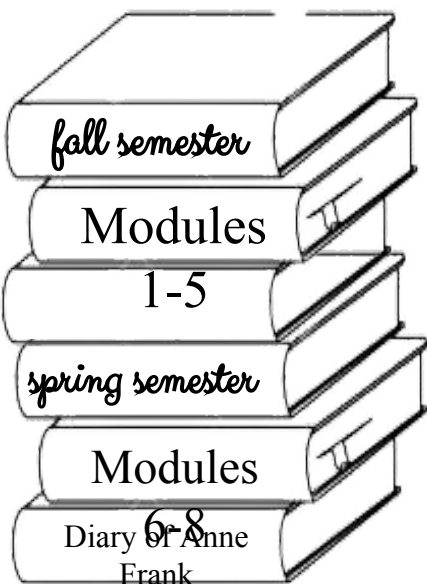
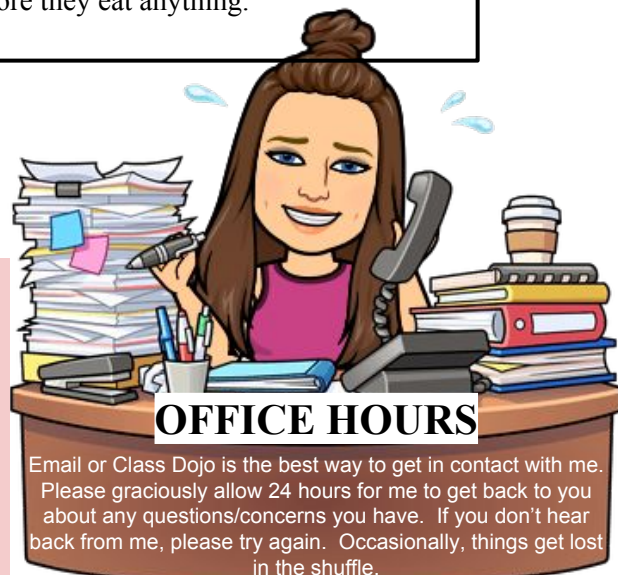

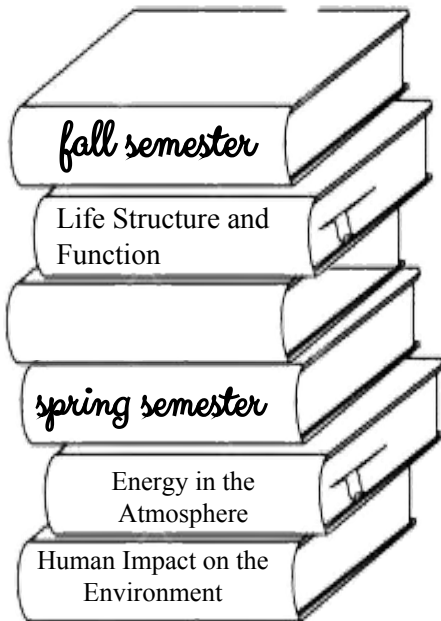

- In Unit 1: Life Structure and Function, we cover Cell Structure and Function, Living Things and the characteristics of living things, Body Functions, Levels of Organization, Structure and Support, Obtaining Energy and Removing waste, Moving Materials in the body (ex: blood, food, oxygen), and Control and Information Processing (5 senses and how the brain sends signals for these). We then go into Energy in The Atmosphere. In this unit, we cover Particle Motion, States of Matter, Thermal Energy Transfer and Conductivity (heat transfer), The Water Cycle, and Weather and Climate.
- Lastly, we learn about the Human Impact on the Environment. This Unit talks about our impact on the land, water, atmosphere, and climate.
