COURSE OBJECTIVES

Enhance movement skills with more complex activities like dribbling, striking, and combining movements. Use pursuit-and-evade games and mini-volleyball to encourage agility, timing, and teamwork. Focus on refining basic skills (throwing, kicking, catching) in new contexts and continue with jump rope routines and simple rallying activities in net/wall games. Students are encouraged to use creativity and problem-solving in games to build confidence and cooperative skills.

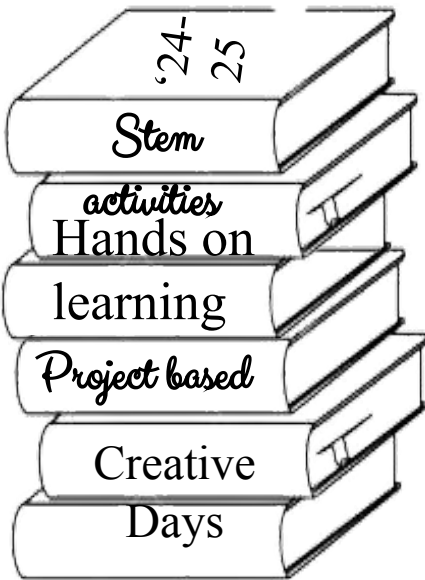

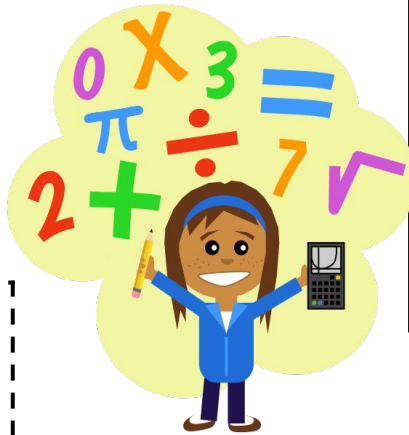
